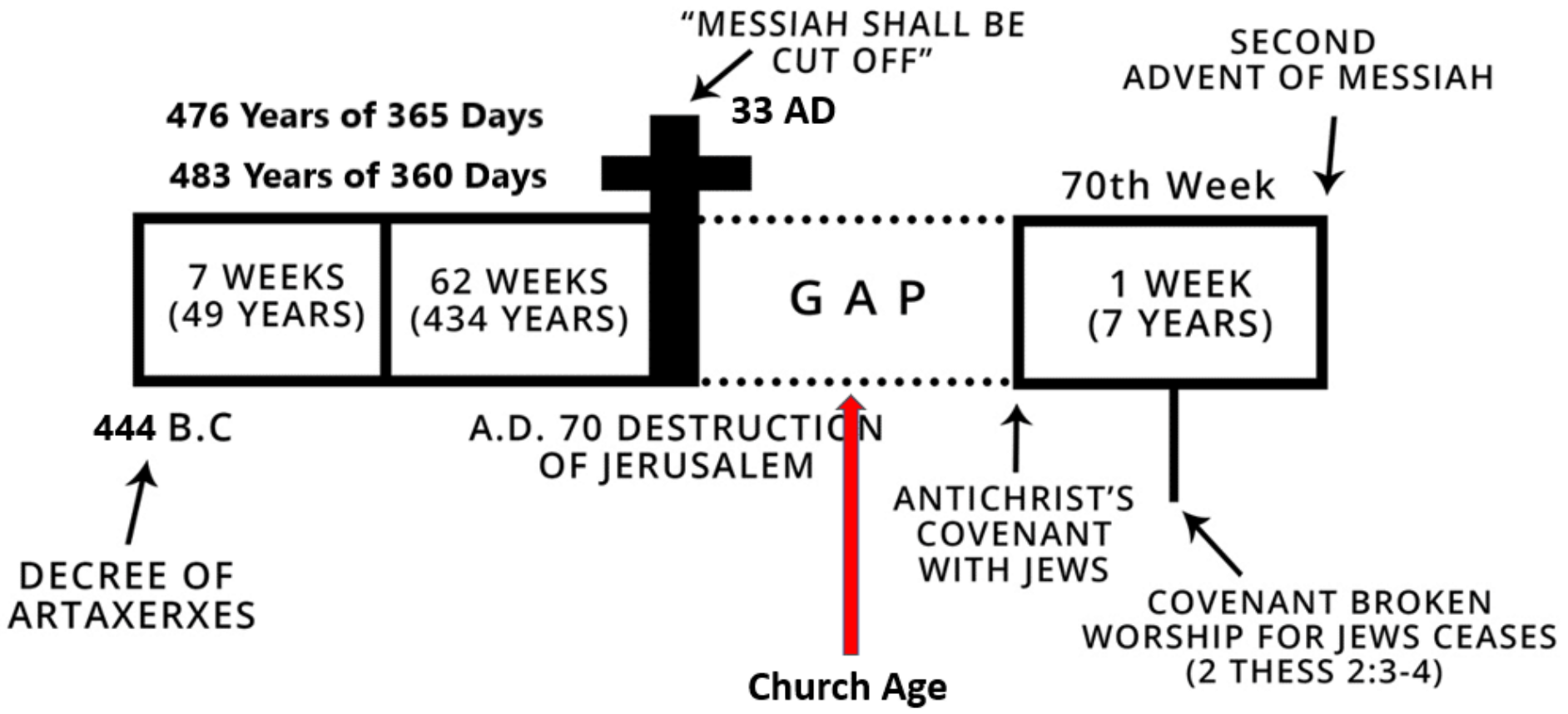

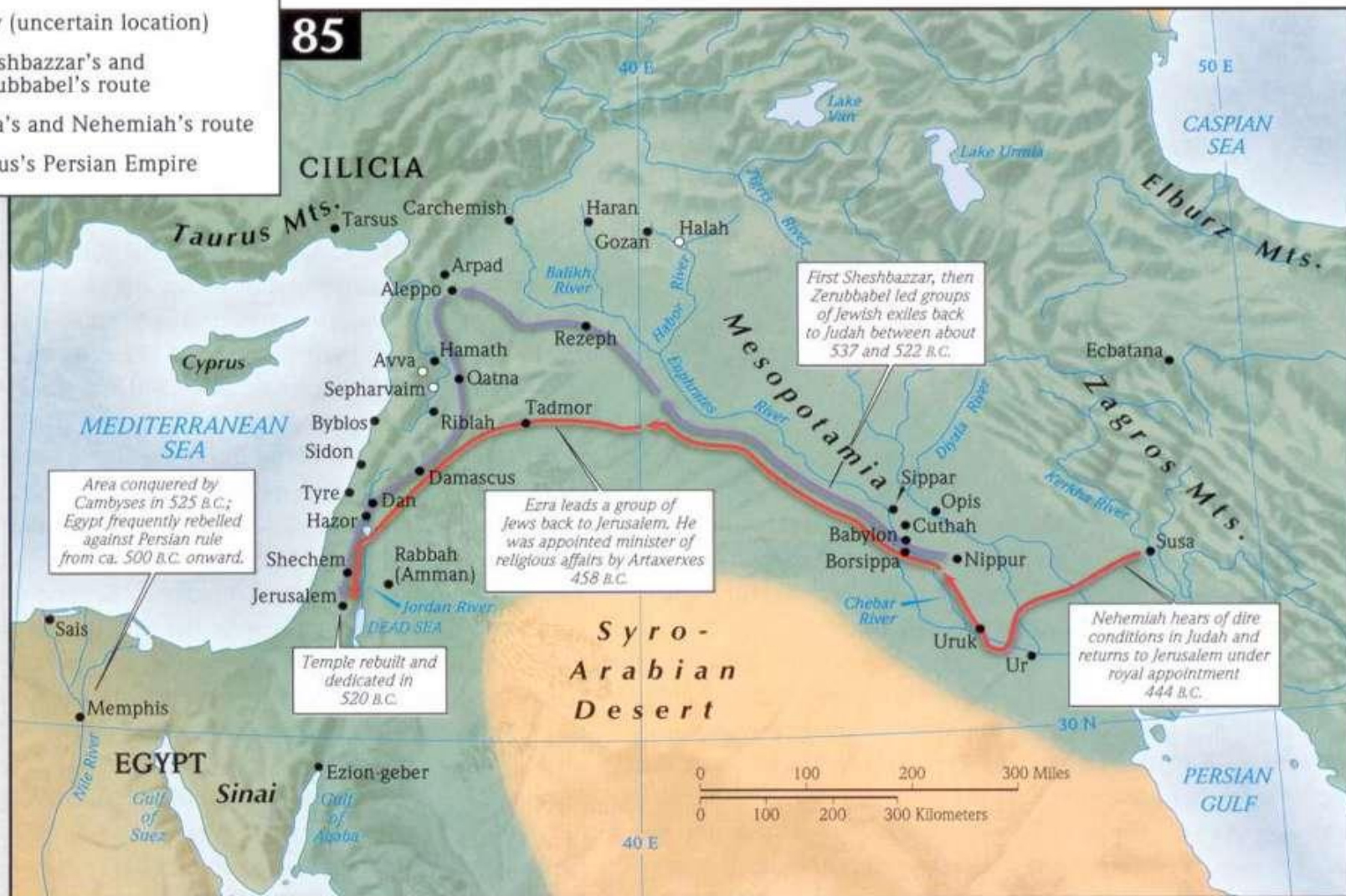


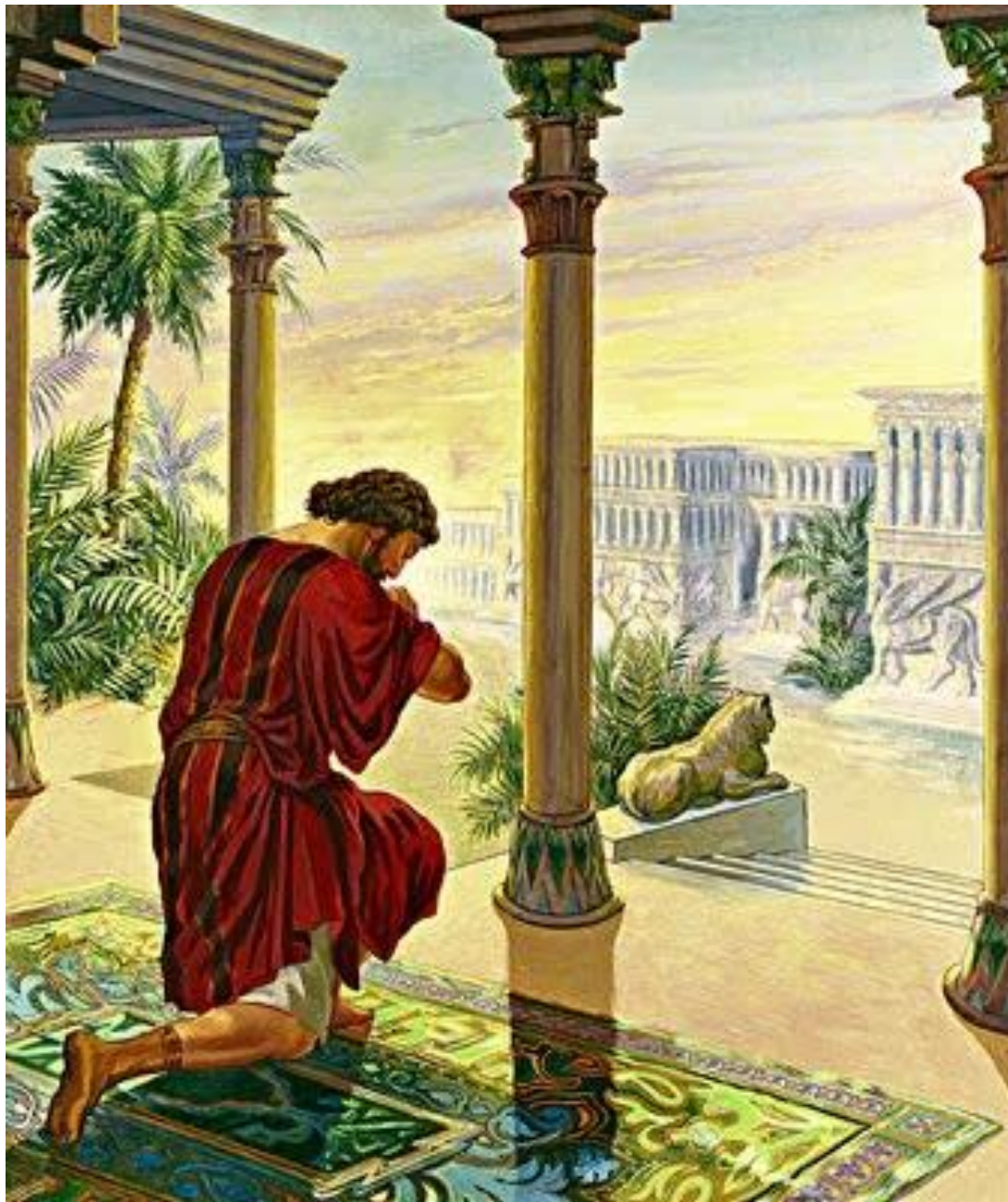
THE RETURNS OF JEWISH EXILES TO JUDAH

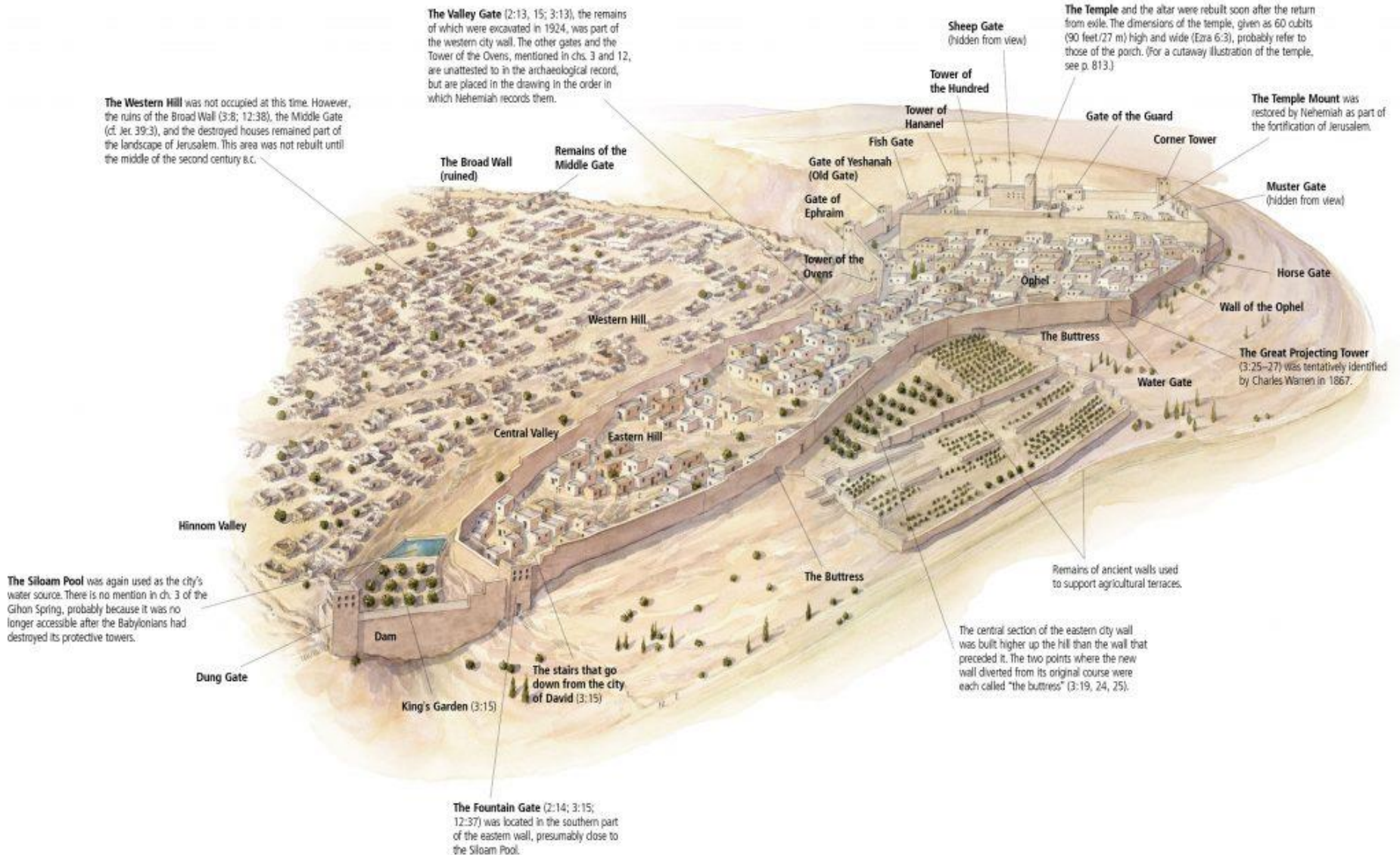


Nehemiah prays to The Lord
